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Before use

■Camera handling









Keep the camera away from excessive vibration, force, or pressure.

- Avoid using the camera under the following conditions, which may damage the lens, LCD monitor, or camera body. This may also cause the camera to malfunction or prevent recording.
 - Dropping or hitting the camera against a hard surface
 - Sitting down with the camera in your pants pocket or forcing it into a full bag
 - Adding accessories to the camera strap
 - Pushing with excessive force on the lens or LCD monitor

The camera is not dust resistant, splash resistant, or waterproof.

Avoid using the camera in places with excessive dust or sand, or where water can come into contact with the camera.

- Avoid using the camera under the following conditions, which present a risk that sand, water, or foreign material may enter the camera through the lens or openings around buttons. Be especially careful because these conditions may damage the camera, and such damage may not be repairable.
 - In extremely dusty or sandy places
 - In the rain or by the shore, where the camera may be exposed to water

■Condensation (When the lens or the LCD monitor is fogged up)



- Condensation may occur when the camera is exposed to sudden changes of temperature or humidity. Avoid these conditions, which may make the lens or LCD monitor dirty, cause mold, or damage the camera.
- If condensation does occur, turn off the camera and wait about two hours before using it. Once the camera adjusts to the surrounding temperature, the fogging will clear naturally.

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Before use

■Always take a test shot first

Before important events when you will use the camera (at weddings, for example), always take a test shot to make sure that pictures and sound record correctly.

■No compensation for missed shots

We cannot compensate for missed shots if technical problems with the camera or card prevent recording.

■Carefully observe copyright laws

Unauthorized use of recordings that contain works with copyright for purposes other than personal use is prohibited under copyright law. Recording of certain material may be restricted even for the purpose of personal use.

- Please note that the actual controls and components, menu items, and other information for your digital camera may differ from those in the illustrations and screens provided in this manual.


Standard Accessories

Check that all the accessories are supplied before using the camera.

- The accessories and their shape will differ depending on the country or area where the camera was purchased.

- Battery Pack is indicated as battery pack or battery in the text.
- Battery Charger is indicated as battery charger or charger in the text.
- SD Memory Card, SDHC Memory Card and SDXC Memory Card are indicated as card in the text.
- Please dispose of all packaging appropriately.
- Keep small parts in a safe place out of the reach of children.

■ Optional accessories

- Cards are optional. You can record or play back pictures on the built-in memory when you are not using a card. (→20)

- 1 Self-timer indicator / AF Assist Lamp Illuminates when the self-timer is set or when the Auto Focus is operated in dark locations. (→116, 143)

 Switches the recording mode. (→48)
- 3 Hot shoe (Hot shoe cover)
 The hot shoe cover is already attached to the hot shoe at the time of purchase.
- 4 Built-in flash (flash)
 Use the flash open switch to open the flash. (→106)
- 5 Shoulder strap eyelet
 Attach the supplied shoulder strap and lens
 cap string to this eyelet. (→13)
- Switches the focus setting. (→96, 102, 104)

 7 Aspect ratio selector switch
- Aspect ratio selector switch
 Switches the aspect ratio of a still picture.

■About the hot shoe cover

Remove the hot shoe cover when using a Live View Finder (optional), External Viewfinder (optional) or External Flash (optional).

Removing the hot shoe cover


While pressing down on the hot shoe cover release button ①. pull the cover in the direction of the arrow ② to detach.


- Be sure to attach the hot shoe cover when the hot shoe is not in use.
- Keep the hot shoe cover safely after removing it so that you do not lose it.
- When the hot shoe cover is removed, make sure that foreign substances such as liquids or sand are not spilled on the dedicated connector.

10 Aperture ring

Adjusts the aperture value. (→60, 62)

11 Microphone

Records sound when you record motion pictures. $(\rightarrow 82)$

12 Zoom lever

Adjusts the recording range. $(\rightarrow 92)$

13 Motion picture button

Press this button to start and stop motion picture recording. (→46)

14 Camera ON/OFF switch

Turns the camera on or off.

15 Shutter button

Press this button to record a still picture. $(\to 46)$

16 Flash open switch

Operate this switch to open the flash. $(\rightarrow 106)$

17 Tripod mount

Attach a tripod or other accessories to this receptacle.

Do not attach to a tripod with a 5.5 mm or longer screw. Doing so may damage this unit

18 Speaker

Do not cover the speaker with your fingers.

19 DC coupler cover


Use the AC adaptor (optional) and DC coupler (optional) specifically for this camera. (→205)


20 Card/Battery door

Open this door to insert and remove a card or battery. $(\rightarrow 18)$

21 Release lever

Slide this lever to open the card/battery door. (→18)





22 LCD monitor (\rightarrow 206)

23 [ND/FOCUS] lever

To operate the lever, move it left or right or push it in. Use this lever for Manual Focus adjustment or for turning the built-in ND filter on/off, etc. (→104, 123)

24 Rear dial

To operate the dial, rotate it left or right or push it in. Use this dial for operations such as adjusting the shutter speed or selecting an operation item. (\rightarrow 61, 62, 124)

25 Terminal cover

How to open the terminal cover



26 [HDMI] socket

Connect the HDMI mini cable (optional) to this socket. $(\rightarrow 183)$


27 [AV OUT/DIGITAL] socket

Connect the USB connection cable or AV cable (optional) to this socket. (→183, 192, 195)

28 Status indicator

This indicator lights up in accordance with the operating conditions of the camera.

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29 Playback button

Switches between recording mode and playback mode. (→152)

30 [MENU/SET]

Mainly used to display menu screens or to set menu items. $(\rightarrow 25)$

31 [WB] button / Right cursor button (▶)

Displays the White Balance setting screen. This button is also used to move the cursor on the menu screens and for other functions. (→25, 111)

32 [DISP.] button

Switches the displayed screens. (\rightarrow 127, 162)

33 [□⊗] button / Down cursor button (▼)

Displays the setting screens for burst, selftimer and other functions. This button is also used to move the cursor on the menu screens and for other functions. (→25, 116, 118, 125)

34 [Q.MENU] button / [m/★] button

Displays the Quick menu in recording mode. Deletes pictures in playback mode. This button is also used to return to the previous screen on the menu screen. $(\rightarrow 129, 163)$

35 [Fn] button / Left cursor button (◄)

Displays the screen of the function registered to the corresponding [Fn] button. This button is also used to move the cursor on the menu screens and for other functions. $(\rightarrow 25, 30)$

36 [ISO] button / Up cursor button (▲)

Displays the setting screen for ISO Sensitivity. This button is also used to move the cursor on the menu screens and for other functions. (→25, 109)

37 [AF/AE LOCK] button

Locks the exposure and focus. (\rightarrow 103, 138)

Attaching the lens cap and shoulder strap

Cover the lens with the lens cap to protect it when you are not taking pictures. We recommend attaching the lens cap to the camera using the lens cap string to prevent loss of the lens cap. We also recommend attaching the shoulder strap to prevent the camera from being dropped.

Use the supplied string to attach the lens cap to the camera





2 Attach the lens cap



To attach and remove the lens cap, press the areas shown by arrows in the illustration.

3 Attach the shoulder strap









Shoulder strap eyelet

- Attach the other end of the shoulder strap.
- Make sure that the shoulder strap does not come loose.
- Attach the shoulder strap with the LUMIX logo on the strap facing out.
- Use the shoulder strap around your shoulder.
 - Do not wrap the strap around your neck. It may result in injury or accident.
- Do not leave the shoulder strap where an infant can reach it.
- It may result in an accident by mistakenly wrapping around the neck.

Always charge before first use! (battery shipped uncharged)


■About batteries that you can use with this unit

If light is flashing:

■Notes on charging time

Charging time

Approx. 155 min

- The charging time indicated above is the time required for charging in case when the battery is completely used up. The time required for charging differs depending on conditions of battery usage. Charging takes longer in cases when temperatures are either high or low and when the battery has not been used for a long period of time.
- Always use genuine Panasonic batteries.
- If you use other batteries, we cannot guarantee the quality of this product.
- Remove battery from camera after use.
 - Keep the battery in a plastic bag, making sure that it is kept away from metallic objects (such as clips) when carrying or storing it.
- To remove the battery, turn the camera off and wait until the LUMIX indicator on the LCD monitor goes off. (Failure to wait may cause the camera to malfunction and may damage the card or recorded data.)
- The unusable battery should be discarded in accordance with battery recycling laws.

Guidelines for number of recordable pictures and operating time

The number of recordable pictures or available operating time may vary according to surrounding environment and usage conditions. Figures may be reduced if flash, zoom, or other functions are used frequently, or in colder climates.

Recording conditions by CIPA standard

CIPA is an abbreviation of [Camera & Imaging Products Association].

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Inserting and removing the battery or SD memory card (optional)

· Set the camera ON/OFF switch to [OFF].



Slide the release lever to the [OPEN] position and open the card/battery door

Release lever

- Insert the battery and card, making sure that their orientation is correct
 - Battery: Insert the battery all the way firmly until a locking sound is heard, and check that the lever is hooked over the battery.
 - Card: Insert the card all the way firmly until it clicks.
- Close the door and slide the release lever to the [LOCK] position



Saving your pictures (cards and built-in memory)

Pictures will be saved to a card if one is inserted, or to the built-in memory [N] if not.

■ Built-in memory (approx. 70 MB)

- Pictures may be copied between cards and the built-in memory. (→182)
- The access time for the built-in memory may be longer than the access time for a card.

Do not subject the camera to vibrations, impact, or static electricity.

The card or the data on the card may be damaged, and this unit may no longer operate normally. If operation fails due to vibration, impact or static electricity, perform the operation again.



Setting the clock

The clock is not set when the camera is shipped.

Preparation: Before using the camera, remove the lens cap.





Turn on the power



The power is turned on.

If the language select screen is not displayed, proceed to step 4.

- Press [MENU/SET] while the message is displayed
- Press ▲ ▼ to select the language and press [MENU/SET]
- The [Please set the clock] message appears.

 Press [MENU/SET]
- Press ◀▶ to select the items (year, month, day, hour, minute, display order or time display format), and press ▲ ▼ to set
- 6 Press [MENU/SET]
- Press [MENU/SET] to set
 - To return to the previous screen, press m/ button.

If the clock is not set, the correct date cannot be printed when you order a photo studio to print the picture, or when you stamp the date on the pictures with [Date Stamp] or [Text Stamp].

[•] If the clock is set, the correct date can be printed even if the date is not displayed on the screen of the camera.

Changing time settings


Select [Clock Set] from the [Setup] menu or [Rec] menu to change the current time settings.

- Clock settings will be saved for approx. 3 months even after battery is removed, provided a fully-charged battery was installed in the camera for 24 hours beforehand.

Setting the menu

You can use the menu to set camera and recording functions, operate playback functions, and perform other operations.



Press [MENU/SET] to bring up the menu



-Each item's background color changes when it is selected

- 2 Select the menu type (→26)
- Press ▲ ▼ to select the menu item and press ▶



Press ▲ ▼ to select the setting and press [MENU/SET]



Press [MENU/SET] to close the menu



 You can also close the menu by pressing the shutter button halfway. (The camera switches to recording mode.)

Selected menu type

- The menu types and items that are displayed vary according to the mode.
- The setting methods vary depending on the menu item.

[Clock Set], [Economy] and [Auto Review] are important for clock setting and battery life. Please check these before use.

For the setting procedures of the menu. (→25)

 In [Intelligent Auto] Mode, only [Clock Set], [World Time], [Beep] and [Stabilizer Demo.] are set.

[Clock Set]

Set time, date, and display format. For details $(\rightarrow 24)$.

[World Time]

Set the recording date and time with the local time at your destination.

- Message will be displayed when setting for the first time. In this case, press [MENU/SET] and skip to step 2.
- Use cursor button to select [Destination] and press [MENU/SET]
- Use cursor button to select area and press [MENU/SET]



When [Destination] has been selected

■To set summer time

Press ▲ in step 2. (Press again to release the setting)

- When summer time is set, the current time is advanced by 1 hour. If the setting is canceled, the time automatically returns to the current time.
- ■When you come back from your travel destination

Select [Home] in step 1 and press [MENU/SET].

- If you cannot find your destination in the area displayed on the screen, set based on difference with home time.
- is displayed on the screen for pictures recorded at the destination when they are played back.
- For the setting procedures of the menu. $(\rightarrow 25)$

[Travel Date]

If you set your travel schedule and record pictures, the day of your trip on which the picture was taken will be recorded.

- 1 Use cursor button to select [Travel Setup] and press ▶
- 2 Use cursor button to select [SET] and press [MENU/SET]
- Use cursor button to select the departure date and press [MENU/SET]
- Use cursor button to select the return date and press [MENU/SET]

■To record [Location]

Once the [Travel Setup] is set, you can set the location.

①Use cursor button in step above to select [Location] and press ►

②Use cursor button to select [SET] and press [MENU/SET]

③Enter your location (Entering text (→44))

- The travel date is calculated from the set departure date and the date set in the camera's clock. When destination is set in [World Time], days elapsed are calculated based on local destination time.
- When [Travel Setup] is set to [OFF], the number of days elapsed is not recorded. It is not displayed even if [Travel Setup] is set to [SET] after recording.
- If settings are made before departure date, number of days to departure are not recorded.
- To print [Location] or the number of days that have passed, either use [Text Stamp] or print using the "PHOTOfunSTUDIO" software on the supplied CD-ROM.
- [Travel Date] cannot be recorded for AVCHD motion pictures.
- [Destination] cannot be recorded for MP4 motion pictures.

For the setting procedures of the menu. (→25)

[LCD Display] / [Viewfinder]

Adjust the brightness and coloring of the LCD monitor. When the display is switched to Live View Finder (optional), the brightness and coloring of the viewfinder are adjusted.

- Press ▲ ▼ to select the setting item, and press ◀ ► to make adjustments
- 2 Press [MENU/SET]
- Some subjects may look different from their actual appearance, but the recorded picture will not be affected.

[LCD Mode]

Make LCD monitor easier to see.

■ Settings

- The brightness is adjusted automatically depending on how bright it is around the camera
- ☐¾: Makes screen brighter than normal (for outdoor use).

[OFF]

- ■Cannot select [A*] in playback mode.
- [<u>**</u>] returns to ordinary brightness if there is no operation for 30 seconds when recording. (Press any button to make the screen brighter again.)
- Because the picture shown on the LCD monitor screen emphasizes brightness, some subjects may look different than their actual appearance, but this will not affect the recorded picture.
- Setting [LCD Mode] reduces the operating time.

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



You can set the aperture values between [1.4] and [8] in 1/3-stop increments. (Set the aperture ring where it clicks.)



The [PSH] in [AVCHD] is a mode that allows motion pictures to be recorded at 1920 x 1080/60p, the highest quality* that complies with the AVCHD standard. Recorded motion pictures can be saved and played back using this unit or "PHOTOfunSTUDIO"

* This means the highest quality for this unit.

MP4.

This is a simpler video format best used when extensive editing is needed, or when uploading videos to the Internet.

■ About the compatibility of the recorded motion pictures

Motion pictures recorded in [AVCHD] or [MP4] may be played back with poor picture or sound quality or playback may not be possible even when played back with equipment compatible with these formats. Also, the recording information may not be displayed properly. In this case, use this unit.

- Motion pictures recorded with [PSH] in [AVCHD] can be played back on equipment that is compatible with AVCHD Progressive.


- About aperture value
 To record motion pictures with a sharp focus on both subject and background, set
 the aperture value to a higher number. To record motion pictures with a defocused
 background, set a lower number.
- About the shutter speed
 To record a sharp motion picture of a fast-moving subject, set a faster shutter speed.
 To record a motion picture with a trailing effect for a subject's movements, set a slower shutter speed.
- Press the shutter button to start and stop recording motion pictures.
- Still pictures cannot be recorded while motion pictures are being recorded.
- The shutter speed that can be set using [Creative Video Mode] is different from the values that can be set using [Program AE], [Aperture-Priority], [Shutter-Priority], and [Manual Exposure] Modes.
- Although you can change camera settings such as shutter speed and aperture value even when a motion picture recording is in progress, the beeps and camera operation sounds may be recorded in some cases.
- When you set a faster shutter speed, the screen noise may increase due to the higher sensitivity.
- When you take a picture under a fluorescent lamp, LED, mercury arc lamp or sodium lamp, for example, the coloring and the brightness of the screen may change.



Registering your own settings and recording



You can adjust the area of a picture to be taken using zoom.





- Adjust the focus after adjusting the zoom.
- Do not touch the lens barrel during zooming.
- The zoom ratio and the zoom bar displayed on the screen are estimates.
- The camera may make a rattling noise and vibrate when the zoom lever is operated this is not a malfunction.

Optical Zoom

[i.Zoom]

You can use the camera's Intelligent Resolution technology to increase the zoom ratio up to 2x higher than the original zoom ratio with limited deterioration of picture quality. Set the [i.Zoom] in the [Rec] menu to [ON]. (\rightarrow 141)

[Digital Zoom]

[Step Zoom]

You can set the zoom operation to allow easy visualization of the angle of view (picture angle) for the focal length of a regular fixed focal length lens (as with a 35 mm film camera). When using the Step Zoom, you can operate the zoom ratio as easily as changing the camera lens.



- The focal length is displayed during playback for pictures recorded using the [Step Zoom].

When Auto Focus is enabled, press the shutter button halfway to focus. Focusing methods differ depending on [Rec] mode and [AF Mode] setting.



- Subjects/environments which may make focusing difficult:
 - Fast-moving or extremely bright objects, or objects with no color contrast.
 - Taking pictures through glass or near objects emitting light. In dark, or with significant jitter.
 - When too close to object or when taking pictures of both distant and close objects together in the same picture.
- The focus display flashes and beep sounds when focus is not aligned. Use the focus range displayed in red as a reference.
 Even if the focus display is lit, the camera may be unable to bring the subject into focus if it is out of range.

Taking front-on pictures of people

Recognizes faces (up to 15 people) and adjusts exposure and focus accordingly.



- AF area

Yellow: When the shutter button is pressed halfway, the frame turns green when the camera is focused.

White: Displayed when more than one face is detected. Other faces that are the same distance away as faces within the yellow AF area are also focused.

- Cannot set to (Face Detection) in the following cases:
 - Scene Modes ([Panorama Shot] [Night Scenery] [Handheld Night Shot] [Food])
 - [Creative Control] Mode ([Soft Focus] [Miniature Effect])





Taking close-up pictures




- In [Intelligent Auto] Mode, the shortest recording distance will be the same as that for [AF♣], regardless of the focus selector switch setting.
- It may take some time until distant subjects come into focus.
- Using a tripod and [Self Timer] is recommended. Also, when recording a subject that is close to the camera, we recommend that you close the flash to set to [�] (Forced flash off).
- Moving the camera after aligning the focus is likely to result in poorly focused pictures
 if subject is close to the camera, due to the margin for focus alignment being severely
 reduced.

Taking pictures by locking the exposure and/or focus



It is convenient to use the [AF/AE LOCK] button when you want to adjust the composition after the subject has been focused and the exposure is set.



- AE Lock will be disabled in [Manual Exposure] Mode and [Scene Mode].

Taking pictures with Manual Focus

Manual Focus is convenient when you want to lock the focus to take pictures or when it is difficult to adjust focus using Auto Focus.



Taking pictures with Manual Focus

- You can adjust the focus using the [ND/FOCUS] lever even during motion picture recording. Note, however, that indications such as MF assist and focus range are not displayed.
- After zoom operation, readjust the focus.
- The focus range displayed by Manual Focus is a reference value. Confirm the focus on the screen ([MF Assist] screen).
- After canceling [Sleep Mode], be sure to readjust the focus.
- When Manual Focus is used together with AE Lock, it is easier to confirm the focus.

■Enlarged display (MF assist)

When [MF Assist] in the [Setup] menu is [ON] and you perform the Manual Focus operation, an enlarged display appears. (MF assist)

- By pushing the [ND/FOCUS] lever during an enlarged display, you can set the magnification to approx. 5x, 10x or 4x (only at the center of the screen).
- Approximately 2 seconds after the Manual Focus operation, the display switches to normal.
- To change the position of an enlarged display
 - Press [MENU/SET] during the Manual Focus operation (while the enlarged display is displayed)
 - ② Use cursor button to move the enlarged display
 - To return the enlarged display to the center → Press [DISP.] button



Taking pictures with the built-in flash



You can use the built-in flash to take pictures in dark locations or light up a subject to adjust the contrast of an entire picture when the background is bright.



When you do not want to use the flash or after using the flash, press down to retract the flash until it clicks.

- Be careful not to catch a finger or any other part of your body or any object when you close the flash.
- Do not put your hands over the light-emitting area of the flash or look at it from close range. Do not use the flash at close distances to other subjects (heat/light may damage subject).
- Do not close the flash immediately after the preliminary flash is operated prior to taking pictures for Auto/Red-Eye Reduction and other flash settings. If you close the flash immediately, it will cause a malfunction.
- When the flash is being charged, the flash icon flashes red, and you cannot take a picture even when you fully press the shutter button.
- The flash effect may not be sufficient in the following cases:
 - Slow shutter speed
 - When [Burst Shooting] is set to [4]
- Flash charging may take time if battery is low or if using flash repeatedly.
- ullet When an External Flash is attached, it will have priority over the built-in flash. (ightarrow201)

When [Red-Eye Removal] in the [Rec] menu is set to [ON], the icon changes to [1/49]/[1/59], redeye is automatically detected and the picture data is corrected. (Only when [AF Mode] is 2 (Face Detection))

- When the built-in flash is closed, [⑤] (Forced flash off) is set regardless of the flash setting.
- In [Intelligent Auto] mode, [i\(\phi^{\alpha}\)] is set and light is emitted according to the subject and the brightness if you open the built-in flash.
- You can adjust the intensity of the flash using [Flash Adjust.] in the [Rec] menu. (→145)
- You can use [Flash Synchro] in the [Rec] menu to set whether the first curtain sync or the second curtain sync will be used. (→144)
- The effect of red-eye reduction varies depending on the subject and is affected by factors such as distance to the subject, whether the subject is looking at the camera during preliminary flash, and so on. In some cases, the effect of red-eye reduction may be negligible.
- Flash settings may be changed when changing recording mode.
- Scene Mode flash settings are restored to default when Scene Mode is changed.
- If light from the flash on a subject is insufficient, neither the proper exposure nor White Balance is achieved







- When [AWB] (Automatic White Balance) is set, the coloring is adjusted in accordance with the light source. However, if the scene is too bright or too dark or if other extreme conditions apply, the pictures may appear reddish or bluish. The White Balance may not operate correctly if there is a multiple number of light sources.

• We recommend setting [AWB], [1] or [2] under fluorescent, LED, or other types of lighting.

[White Balance] setting is fixed to [AWB] in the following cases:
 Scene Modes ([Scenery], [Night Portrait], [Night Scenery], [Handheld Night Shot],
 [Food], [Sunset])

 Even if the camera's power is OFF, the set White Balance is remembered. (If the Scene Mode is changed, the white balance setting returns automatically to [AWB].)

Setting the White Balance manually

Take a picture of a white object under the target light source to adjust colors.

- 1 Press [WB] button
- Press ▲ ▼ to select either [♣] or [♣] and press ▶
- Point the camera at a white object such as a piece of paper, ensuring that it is inside the frame at the center of the screen, and press [MENU/SET]
- Even if the camera's power is OFF, the set White Balance is remembered.
- It may not be possible to set the correct White Balance if subjects are too bright or too dark. In this case, adjust the brightness and try to set the White Balance again.

Setting the White Balance using color temperature

You can set the White Balance using color temperature. Color temperature is a numeric value that expresses the color of light (unit: K*). A picture becomes bluish when the color temperature value is higher, and reddish when the temperature value is lower.

Performing White Balance fine adjustments

White Balance settings can be individually fine-tuned if colors still do not appear as anticipated.

- Use ▲ ▼ ◀► to perform fine adjustments and press [MENU/SET]

- ►: B (blue: bluish colors)
- ▼: M- (magenta: reddish colors)

- When you perform fine adjustments of the White Balance toward the A (amber) or B (blue) side, the color of the White Balance icon displayed on the screen will change to the fine-tuned color.
- When you perform fine adjustments of the White Balance toward the G+ (green) or M- (magenta) side, [+] (green) or [-] (magenta) will be displayed in the White Balance icon on the screen.
- When fine adjustments of the White Balance are not performed, select the center point.
- Settings remain applied when using flash.
- You can perform fine adjustments of the White Balance independently for each White Balance setting item.
- Settings are remembered even if the camera is turned off.
- When you reset the White Balance in [♣] or [♣], or reset the color temperature in [★☑], the White Balance fine adjustment level will return to the standard setting (center point).

Bracket recording using White Balance

Bracket settings are performed based on the fine adjustment values for White Balance, and three pictures with different coloring are automatically recorded when the shutter button is pressed once.



Taking pictures with self-timer



We recommend using a tripod. This is also effective for correcting jitter when pressing the shutter button, by setting the self-timer to 2 seconds.


Setting the burst function

- •When [@] is set, the recording range will be narrower.
- Depending on changes in the brightness of the subject, the second and subsequent pictures may be recorded brighter or darker when using the burst function at the [□], [□], [□] or [望] setting.
- Even if [☑] or [☑] is set, the focus is fixed on the first picture when the burst function is used during motion picture recording.
- Burst speed may be reduced if shutter speed is reduced in darker locations.
- The pictures taken using the burst function at the [□] or [□] setting may be distorted if the subjects were moving or the camera was moved.
- The flash is set to [♠] (Forced flash off). (Excluding [♠])
- Settings will be stored even if power is turned off.
- The burst function cannot be used in the following cases:
 - [Creative Control] Mode ([Toy Effect] [Miniature Effect] [Soft Focus] [Star Filter]




Using the built-in ND filter



When you want to take pictures using the maximum aperture in a bright outdoor location or at a slow shutter speed, you can use the built-in ND filter to reduce the amount of light that passes through the lens.



Press the [ND/FOCUS] lever to activate the ND filter



- When pictures are taken in portrait orientation, the level gauge is automatically switched to one for portrait orientation.
- Even when angle is more or less corrected, there may be an error of about ±1 degree.
- Every time you press ■ when [Fn Button Set] of the [Setup] menu is set to [Level Gauge], you can turn the level gauge indication on and off.
- When the camera is being moved, the level gauge may not be displayed correctly.
- The level gauge may not be displayed correctly or the direction detect function may not operate correctly if the pictures are taken with the camera pointing sharply up or down.

Using Quick menu

In recording mode, you can quickly change the main settings of a still picture or a motion picture.



• The menu items and setting items that are displayed differ depending on the recording mode.



Default [Face Recog.] setting is [OFF].
When the face pictures are registered, the setting will be [ON] automatically.

■ How the Face Recognition function works During recording

(When [AF Mode] is (Face Detection))

- The camera recognizes a registered face and adjusts focus and exposure.
- When registered faces that have set names are recognized, the names are displayed (max. 3 people).

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During playback

- The name and age are displayed (if information is registered).
- The names that have been set for the recognized faces are displayed (max. 3 people).
- Only pictures of the selected registered people are played back ([Category Selection]).
- Only the first picture of the burst recording will contain Face Recognition information.
- If you press the shutter button halfway, then point the camera at a different subject and record, recording information for a different person may be put on the picture.
- Face Recognition does not work in the following cases:
 - Motion picture
 - Scene Modes ([Panorama Shot] [Night Scenery] [Handheld Night Shot] [Food] [3D Photo Mode])
 - [Creative Control] Mode ([Miniature Effect] [Soft Focus])
- Face Recognition searches for faces similar to those registered, but there is no guarantee it will always recognize these faces. In some cases, the camera cannot recognize or incorrectly recognizes even registered people depending on their expression or the environment.
- Even if Face Recognition information is registered, pictures recorded when the name is [OFF] are not categorized for Face Recognition in [Category Selection].
- Even if Face Recognition information is changed, Face Recognition information for previously recorded pictures is not changed.
 - For example, if a name is changed, pictures recorded before the change are not categorized for Face Recognition in [Category Selection].
- To change name information for pictures already recorded, perform a [REPLACE]
 (→181) in [Face Rec Edit].

Registering face pictures

Up to 6 people's face pictures can be registered along with such information as name and birthdate.

You can facilitate Face Recognition by the way you register faces: for example, register multiple face pictures of the same person (up to 3 pictures in one registration).

■If the camera seems to have difficulty recognizing faces when recording

- Register additional pictures of the same person's face, indoors and outdoors or with different expressions or angles.
- · Register additional pictures at the place you are recording.
- If a registered person is no longer recognized, re-register that person.

■About interval recording

When the shutter button is pressed fully, interval recording will start and the camera automatically takes pictures.

- During recording standby, the camera turns off automatically when no operation is performed for a preset interval. At the time to start recording or after the interval of recording time, the camera turns on automatically and the lens moves to the zoom position (focal length) to take a picture. (Do not attach the lens cap during recording standby.)
- When the camera ON/OFF switch is set to [OFF], interval recording will end. To
 continue interval recording, leave the camera ON/OFF switch to [ON].

- Pictures taken using interval recording cannot be stored in the built-in memory.
- The interval recording function is not intended for application-specific systems (monitoring cameras).
- If you leave the camera unattended during interval recording, make sure that the camera is not stolen.
- Exercise caution when you perform interval recording for a long period of time in cold regions or in a low-temperature or high-temperature/high-humidity environment, since such use could cause malfunctions.
- There is a possibility of the camera moving when it automatically turns on or off, for example, when the lens is retracting into the camera housing. We recommend fixing the camera to a tripod or using other methods on a stable surface when you take pictures using interval recording. Make sure that the camera does not topple over because of wind or other causes.
- This function cannot be used for recording motion pictures.
- Use a fully charged battery.
- Interval recording will be interrupted and the setting will be canceled in the following cases.
 - When the remaining battery power runs out
 - · When the maximum number of pictures that can be recorded has been reached
- Do not connect the AV cable (optional), HDMI mini cable (optional), and USB connection cable during interval recording.

- Bit rate is the data volume for a given period of time. The bigger the volume, the higher the picture quality. This unit uses the "VBR" recording method. "VBR" is an abbreviation of "Variable Bit Rate", and the bit rate (volume of data for definite period of time) is changed automatically depending on the subject to record. Therefore, the recording time is shortened when a subject with fast movement is recorded.
- The aspect ratio of motion pictures is set using [Rec Quality]. The aspect ratio of motion pictures will not be changed even if you operate the aspect ratio selector switch.
- You can record motion pictures to the built-in memory only in [VGA] mode.







- There are restrictions on some playback functions.

- When an HDMI mini cable is connected, pictures are not displayed on the LCD monitor.
- HDMI output will be canceled if a USB connection cable is connected simultaneously.
- When the AV cable (optional) and HDMI mini cable (optional) are connected at the same time, no picture is output from the AV cable.
- Pictures may be momentarily distorted immediately after commencing playback or pausing on certain televisions.
- Audio output is stereo.

■ To connect with an AV cable (optional)

- Always use a genuine Panasonic AV cable (optional).
- Pictures rotated to portrait may be blurred slightly.
- Change picture mode settings on TV if aspect ratios are not displayed correctly on widescreen or high-definition televisions.

When you insert a card into the SD card slot in a television or a DVD recorder, you can play back recorded still pictures.

- AVCHD motion pictures can be played back on Panasonic televisions (VIERA) displaying the AVCHD logo.
- You may not be able to play back panorama pictures. Also you cannot perform automatic scrolling playback of panorama pictures.
- When using both SDHC and SDXC Memory Cards, be sure to play each type of card in equipment compatible with the particular format.

VIERA Link (HDMI) (HDAVI Control™)

What is VIERA Link (HDMI)?

- VIERA Link™ is a new name for EZ Svnc™.
- VIERA Link is a function that automatically links this camera to VIERA Linkcompatible devices by connecting HDMI mini cables (optional) for enabling easy operation with the VIERA remote control. (Some operations are not available.)
- VIERA Link (HDMI) is an exclusive Panasonic function added to the industrystandard HDMI control functions known as HDMI CEC (Consumer Electronics Control). Operation is not guaranteed when connecting with non-Panasonic HDMI CEC-compatible devices. Refer to your product manual to verify compatibility with VIERA Link (HDMI).
- This camera supports VIERA Link (HDMI) Version 5. This is the latest Panasonic standard that also supports previous Panasonic VIERA Link devices. (As of November 2011)
- Always use a genuine Panasonic HDMI mini cable (optional).
- If you are unsure whether the TV you are using is compatible with VIERA Link, read the operating instructions for the TV.
- Cables that do not comply with HDMI standards will not work.
- If the [VIERA Link] setting on the camera is [ON], operations via the camera buttons will be limited.
- Ensure that the television you are connecting to has been set up to enable VIERA Link (HDMI) (consult your television operating instructions for details).

Preparation: Set [VIERA Link] to [ON] $(\rightarrow 40)$.

- 1 Connect the camera to a VIERA Link (HDMI)-compatible Panasonic television (VIERA) with an HDMI mini cable (optional) (→183)
- 2 Turn on the camera

- Proceed with the operation while referring to what is displayed on the TV screen

■Other related operations

Power OFF

The camera's power can also be switched off when switching the television's power off with the remote control.

 whenever the camera's power is switched on while it is connected via the HDMI
 mini cable. The television can also be switched on via the camera from Standby
 Mode (if "Power on link" on the television is set to "on").

Viewing 3D still pictures

If you connect this camera to a 3D-capable TV, and play back still pictures that you recorded in 3D, you can enjoy impressive 3D still pictures on the TV. If a 3D-capable TV has an SD card slot, you can play back 3D still pictures that you recorded by inserting the card into the slot.

- 1 Connect the camera to a 3D-capable TV by use of an HDMI mini cable (optional) to display the playback screen (→183)

 - When the [VIERA Link] setting on the camera is set to [ON] and the camera is connected to a VIERA Link (HDMI)-compatible Panasonic television (VIERA), the television automatically switches its input and the playback screen is displayed.

- When an image is not suitable for 3D viewing (due to excessive parallax, etc.)
 - During Slide Show playback: The image is displayed in 2D.
 - During [Filtering Play]: A message appears confirming whether to display the image in 3D or not.
- When a 3D image is played back on a TV that is not 3D-capable, 2 pictures may appear side-by-side on the screen.
- On the LCD monitor of this camera, 3D still pictures will be played back in 2D (conventional pictures).
- If you switch between 3D still pictures and normal still pictures while playing back pictures, a black screen will be displayed for a few seconds.
- If you select a thumbnail of 3D still pictures or display a thumbnail after playing back 3D still pictures, it may take a few seconds to start playing back or displaying the pictures.
- Viewing 3D still pictures too close to a TV may cause eyestrain.
- When a TV has not been converted for viewing 3D still pictures, do necessary
 preparation on the TV. (For details about the necessary preparation of the TV, read
 the manual for the TV.)

- You can store 3D still pictures on a computer or Panasonic recorder. (→189)

Storing recorded still pictures and motion pictures

The methods for copying still and motion pictures recorded with this camera to other devices vary according to the file format (JPEG, RAW, MPO, AVCHD, MP4). Follow the correct method for your device.

Copying by inserting the SD card into the recorder

You can copy pictures using Panasonic equipment (such as Blu-ray disc recorders) with support for each file format.



Dubbing playback pictures via AV cables (optional)

Videos that are played on this camera can be dubbed on media such as a disc, hard disk or videotape using a device such as a video recorder. This method is useful as it allows dubbing to be performed even with devices that are not compatible with high definition images. Picture quality will be reduced from high definition to standard definition. Audio will be monaural.

- 1 Connect camera to recorder
- 2 Start playback on camera
- Start recording on recorder
 - To stop recording (dubbing), stop the recording on your recorder first before stopping the playback on the camera.



To recorder's input socket

- Always use a genuine Panasonic AV cable (optional).
- When using a TV with a 4:3 aspect ratio, always change the camera's [TV Aspect] setting (→39) to [4:3] before dubbing. Motion pictures copied in the 16:9 setting will appear vertically stretched when viewed on a 4:3 TV screen.

Using the "PHOTOfunSTUDIO" software on the supplied CD-ROM, you can save still pictures and motion pictures recorded with this camera in all file formats to a computer.

 - For details about the software on the supplied CD-ROM, operation environment and installation, refer to Basic Owner's Manual.
- 2 Connect the camera to your computer

- 3 Use "PHOTOfunSTUDIO" to copy pictures to your computer • For details on how to use "PHOTOfunSTUDIO", see the "PHOTOfunSTUDIO" manual (PDF).
- Files and folders containing copied AVCHD motion pictures cannot be played back or edited if they have been deleted, modified, or moved using Windows Explorer or similar methods. Always use "PHOTOfunSTUDIO" when handling AVCHD motion pictures.

Using with your PC

Still/motion pictures can be copied from the camera to your computer by connecting the two together.

- Some computers can read directly from the camera's memory card. For details, see the manual for your computer.
- If your computer does not support SDXC Memory Cards a message will be displayed requesting you to format the card. (Do not format the card. This will erase recorded pictures.) You can connect the camera to a computer that can detect a mass storage device (device that stores a large volume of data).

- When using Windows, be sure to use the "PHOTOfunSTUDIO" software on the supplied CD-ROM to copy motion pictures recorded in [AVCHD].
- When using Mac, you can copy motion pictures recorded in [AVCHD] using "iMovie '11". Note, however, that you cannot copy motion pictures (AVCHD Progressive) recorded when [Rec Quality] is set to [PSH]. (For details about iMovie '11, please contact Apple Inc.)





Using the uploading tool ([LUMIX Image Uploader]), you can upload still pictures and motion pictures to image-sharing websites (Facebook or YouTube).

There is no need to copy pictures to your computer or install specialized software. Uploading pictures from the camera is easy with a computer connected to a network, even when you are away from your regular computing environment.

• If you have installed "PHOTOfunSTUDIO" software from the CD-ROM (supplied), "Uploading tool ([LUMIX Image Uploader])" may start automatically.



- Do not upload pictures protected by copyright except when you are the copyright holder or permission has been obtained from the corresponding copyright holder.

You can connect directly to a PictBridge-compatible printer for printing.

Preparation:

- Charge the battery sufficiently. Or, connect the AC adaptor (optional) and DC coupler (optional).
- When printing pictures from the built-in memory, remove any memory cards.
- Adjust the print quality or other settings on your printer, as needed.
- · Turn on the camera and printer.



- Connect camera to printer
 - Do not use cables other than the supplied USB connection cable or a genuine Panasonic USB connection cable (optional). Using cables other than the above may cause a malfunction.
- Use cursor button on the camera to select [PictBridge(PTP)] and press [MENU/SET]
- Use cursor button to select a picture to print and press [MENU/SET]
- Use cursor button to select [Print start] and press [MENU/SET] (Print settings (→198))
- To cancel print Press [MENU/SET].

- Do not use any other USB connection cables except the supplied one or a genuine Panasonic USB connection cable (optional).
- Disconnect USB connection cable after printing.
- Turn off power before inserting or removing memory cards.
- Use a sufficiently charged battery or an AC adaptor (optional) and DC coupler (optional). When the battery begins to run out while the camera is connected to the printer, the status indicator flashes and a warning beep sounds. Cancel printing and disconnect USB connection cable.
- Still pictures recorded in a RAW file cannot be printed. (The still pictures recorded in JPEG file format at the same time as the RAW file can be printed.)
- Motion pictures cannot be printed.
- Some printers can print directly from the camera's memory card. For details, see the manual for your printer.

Printing multiple pictures

Printing with date and text

■ Printing date without [Text Stamp]

- Printing in store: Only recording date can be printed. Request date printing in store.
 - Making [Print Set] (→179) settings on the camera in advance allows settings for numbers of copies and date printing to be designated before giving the card to the store.
 - When printing still pictures with a 16:9 aspect ratio, check in advance that the store can accept this size.
- Using computer: Print settings for recording date and text information can be made using "PHOTOfunSTUDIO" software on the supplied CD-ROM.
- Using printer: Recording date can be printed by setting [Print Set] on the camera, or by setting [Print with Date] (→198) to [ON] when connecting to a printer compatible with date printing.
- Time and date can be set to be printed on the picture when taking the picture by activating the [Date Stamp] function in the [Rec] menu. (→149)

Making print settings on the camera

Setting options include the number of printed pictures and their size. Make settings before selecting [Print start].

Using the Live View Finder (optional)

When the Live View Finder (DMW-LVF2: optional) is used, you can view the recording screen even when taking pictures at a low camera angle, for example.

Preparation:

- Turn the camera ON/OFF switch to [OFF].
- Remove the hot shoe cover attached to the camera. $(\rightarrow 9)$
- 1 Firmly insert the Live View Finder into the hot shoe, as far as it will go
- 2 Turn the camera ON/OFF switch to [ON]
- Press the [LVF/LCD] button of the Live View Finder to switch the display
 - You can switch between the LCD (LCD monitor) display and LVF (Live View Finder) display.
 - The display selected by pressing the [LVF/LCD] button will be stored in memory even when the camera ON/OFF switch is set to [OFF].

■To automatically display the playback screen on the LCD monitor

When [Play on LCD] $(\rightarrow 37)$ of the [Setup] menu is set to [ON], the LCD monitor will turn on when the camera is switched from recording mode to playback mode. This operation eliminates the time needed to switch between LCD monitor and Live View Finder when recording pictures using Live View Finder.

- Attach and detach the Live View Finder carefully and correctly.
- The Live View Finder cannot be used together with an external flash.
- When the shoulder strap is attached, make sure that the strap does not get snagged on the Live View Finder
- Be sure to hold both the camera and the Live View Finder when the Live View Finder is attached to the camera. If you hold only the Live View Finder, it could become detached from the camera.
- Refer to the operating instructions for the Live View Finder for further details.

Using the External Viewfinder (optional)

When the External Viewfinder (DMW-VF1: optional) is attached, you can use it to view the recording screen when taking wide-angle pictures.

Preparation:

- Turn the camera ON/OFF switch to [OFF].
- Remove the hot shoe cover attached to the camera. $(\rightarrow 9)$
- Firmly insert the External Viewfinder into the hot shoe, as far as it will go
- 2 Turn the camera ON/OFF switch to [ON]

■If the LCD monitor is too bright when you look through the viewfinder eyepiece

You can turn off the LCD monitor during recording by setting [Opt. Viewfinder] (\rightarrow 146) of [Rec] menu to [ON].

- The status indicator lights up.
- · Press [DISP.] button to switch the display.
- The field-of-view frame of the External Viewfinder indicates the area that can be used for a 24 mm lens (35 mm film camera equivalent, aspect ratio 3:2, Wide).
- The frame lines are a reference for the recording range. Check the LCD monitor for a more accurate view.
- If the lens surface gets dirty, wipe it with a dry soft cloth.
- Attach and detach the External Viewfinder carefully and correctly.
- The External Viewfinder cannot be used together with an external flash.
- When the shoulder strap is attached, make sure that the strap does not get snagged on the External Viewfinder
- Be sure to hold both the camera and the External Viewfinder when the External Viewfinder is attached to the camera. If you hold only the External Viewfinder, it could become detached from the camera.
- Refer to the operating instructions for the External Viewfinder for further details.

Using the external flash (optional)

When you use an external flash (DMW-FL220, DMW-FL360, DMW-FL500; optional), it provides a wider effective flash range than the built-in flash.

Preparation:

- Set the camera ON/OFF switch to [OFF] and close the built-in flash.
- Remove the hot shoe cover attached to the camera. $(\rightarrow 9)$
- 1 Attach the flash to the hot shoe and turn on the camera and flash
- 2 Select [Flash] from the [Rec] menu
- For the setting procedures of the menu. (→25)
- Use cursor button to select the flash mode setting and press [MENU/SET]
 - While the external flash is connected, the following icons are displayed.
 - **≰**A : AUTO
 - \$A⊚: AUTO/Red-Eye Reduction
 - # : Forced flash on
 - \$\$@: Slow sync./Red-Eye Reduction
 - Forced flash off

■When using other commercially available external flashes that don't offer direct communication with the camera (DMC-LX7)

- It is necessary to set the exposure on the external flash when it is used. When you use an external flash in Auto Mode, use an external flash that allows you to set the aperture value and ISO Sensitivity to match the same settings on the camera.
- Set the camera to [Aperture-Priority] Mode or [Manual Exposure] Mode and then
 set the same aperture value and ISO Sensitivity on the external flash. (The proper
 exposure cannot be achieved because the aperture value changes in [ShutterPriority] Mode. The light of the external flash cannot be properly adjusted since the
 aperture value cannot be fixed in [Program AE] Mode.)

Digital Camera Accessory System

- The external flash cannot be used together with the Live View Finder (optional) or External Viewfinder (optional).
- You can set the aperture value, shutter speed and ISO Sensitivity on the camera even when the external flash is attached.
- Some commercially available external flashes have synchro terminals with high-voltage or reversed polarity. If such flashes are used, they could cause a malfunction or hinder normal operation of the camera.
- Do not use an external flash with communication functions other than a flash (optional) for this camera. If you use other flashes, they may fail to operate properly and may also cause the camera to malfunction.
- Some external flashes put the camera into external flash mode as soon as they are mounted on the camera, even if the external flash is turned off. If you are not using the external flash, detach it from the camera.
- When the external flash is attached, do not open the built-in flash.
- When the external flash is attached, the camera will become unstable, and therefore we recommend using a tripod to take pictures.
- Detach the external flash when you carry the camera.
- Be sure to hold both the camera and the external flash when it is attached to the camera. If you hold only the external flash, it could become detached from the camera
- If the White Balance is set to [

 | when the external flash is used, perform fine adjustment of the White Balance if the recording results are not satisfactory. (→113)
- If you take pictures close to the subject while taking wide-angle pictures, the light of the flash is obstructed by the lens and the bottom of the screen may be dark.
- Refer to the operating instructions of the external flash for further details.

Using the filter (optional)

When you use a filter adaptor kit (optional: DMW-FA1), you can use the following filters. (As of July 2012)


PL filter DMW-LPLA37*	The PL filter helps suppress light reflected from a metal or non-spherical surface (flat non-metallic surfaces, water vapor or invisible fine particles in the air) and enables you to take still pictures with enhanced contrast.
MC protector DMW-LMCH37	The MC protector is a transparent filter that causes little change in colors or light intensity and can be used to protect the camera lens.
ND filter DMW-LND37	The ND filter does not cause any change in colors but it can reduce only the light intensity by 1/8th (equivalent to adjusting the aperture value by 3 stops).

^{*} You cannot use the camera with a PL filter (DMW-LPL37) installed on it. (The DMW-LPL37 is thicker than the DMW-LPLA37, so the surrounding parts of the screen may sometimes darken (when vignetting, for example).)

■How to install a filter adaptor

Preparation:

- Set [Sleep Mode] in the [Setup] menu to [OFF] (→36).
- Remove the lens cap, and turn the camera ON/OFF switch to [ON].



Spread a soft cloth on a flat desk, and place the unit on it, with the LCD facing down



- Remove the thread protector from the end part of the lens by turning it in the direction of arrow ①
 - Gently hold the lens barrel with your fingers, and turn the thread protector with the opposite hand.
- Install the filter adaptor by turning it in the direction of arrow ②
 - Gently hold the lens barrel with your fingers, and turn the filter adaptor with the opposite hand


- When you take pictures using the built-in flash with the filter adaptor installed, the light from the flash is sometimes blocked by the filter adaptor.
- When installing or removing the filter adaptor, take care not to damage the lens or get it dirty.
- When installing or removing the thread protector or filter adaptor etc., turn it slowly and carefully. (If you tighten it too firmly, you may be unable to remove it.)
- When you use the lens cap supplied with the filter adaptor kit, you can install it with the filter installed.
- Do not attach multiple filters at the same time.
- You can only use filters and cannot attach and use conversion lens, etc. If you attach
 a conversion lens, it could cause a camera malfunction. (As of July 2012)
- Refer to the operating instructions of the relevant filters for further details.

Using the AC adaptor (optional) and DC coupler (optional) instead of the battery

By using the AC adaptor (optional) and DC coupler (optional), you can record and play back without worrying about the remaining battery charge.

The optional DC coupler can only be used with the designated Panasonic AC adaptor.





- Insert DC coupler instead of battery
- Open DC coupler cover
 - If difficult to open, with the card/ battery door open, press the DC coupler cover from the inside to open it.
- Close the door and slide the release lever to the [LOCK] position
- Plug AC adaptor into power outlet
- 5 Connect AC adaptor to DC IN socket of DC coupler


- Always use a genuine Panasonic AC adaptor (optional).
- Use the AC adaptor and DC coupler specifically for this camera. Using other adaptors
 or couplers could cause camera failure.
- It may not be possible to install camera on a tripod or unipod when the DC coupler is connected, depending on the type of tripod or unipod.
- The camera cannot be stood up when the AC adaptor is connected. If you are leaving the camera on a surface as you work, it is recommended to set it on a soft cloth.
- When the AC adaptor is connected, always remove the AC adaptor when opening the card/battery door.
- Remove the AC adaptor and DC coupler when not in use and close the DC coupler cover
- Also read the AC adaptor and DC coupler operating instructions.

- A MultiMediaCard was inserted.
 - → Not compatible with the camera. Use a compatible card.

[Some pictures cannot be deleted] [This picture cannot be deleted]

- Non-DCF pictures (→152) cannot be deleted.
 - → Save needed data on a computer or other device, and then use [Format] on the camera. (→42)

[No additional selections can be made]

- The number of pictures that can be deleted at once has been exceeded.
- More than 999 pictures have been set as [Favorite].
- The number of pictures allowing [Title Edit], [Text Stamp] or [Resize] (multiple settings) at once has been exceeded.

[Cannot be set on this picture]

[Print Set], [Title Edit], or [Text Stamp] cannot be made for non-DCF pictures (→152).

[Please turn camera off and then on again] [System Error]

- The lens is not working correctly.
 - → Turn on power again.
 - (Consult the dealer or your nearest Service Center if display still remains)

[Some pictures cannot be copied] [Copy could not be completed]

- Data read has failed.
 - \rightarrow Check whether card has been inserted correctly (\rightarrow 18).
- Data write has failed.
 - → Turn off the camera and remove the card. Reinsert the card and turn the camera on again.
- Card may possibly be damaged.
- Try with a different card.

[Cannot record due to incompatible format(NTSC/PAL) data on this card.]

- Format the card after saving necessary data on a PC etc. $(\rightarrow 42)$
- Insert a different card.

[Motion recording was cancelled due to the limitation of the writing speed of the card]

- If recording stops even when using a card of the recommended speed class (→20), the data writing speed has dropped. If this happens, we recommend backing up the data on the memory card and formatting it (→42).
- Motion picture recording may be automatically terminated with certain cards.

[A folder cannot be created]

- Folder numbers in use have reached 999.
 - → Save needed data on a computer or other device, and then use [Format] on the camera (→42). Folder number is reset to 100 when performing [No.Reset] (→38).

- AV cable (optional) is connected to camera.

[This battery cannot be used]



If the problem persists, performing [Reset] in the [Setup] menu may resolve the issue $(\rightarrow 39)$. Note that except for some items such as [Clock Set], all settings are returned to their values at the time of purchase.

Battery, power

Camera does not work even if power is turned on.

Battery is not inserted correctly (→18), or needs recharging.

LCD monitor shuts off even if power is turned on.

Camera switches off as soon as power is turned on.

- [Opt. Viewfinder] is set to [ON].
 - → Press [DISP.] button to switch to the LCD monitor display.
- The Live View Finder (optional) display is selected.
 - → Press the [LVF/LCD] button of the Live View Finder (optional) to switch to the LCD monitor display.
- [Economy] ([Sleep Mode] or [Auto LCD Off]) is activated. (→36)
 - → Press shutter button halfway to release.
- Battery needs recharging.

This unit is turned off automatically.

 If you connect to a TV compatible with VIERA Link (HDMI) with an HDMI mini cable (optional) and turn off the power on the TV with the remote control for the TV, the power on this unit also turns off.
 → If you are not using VIERA Link (HDMI), set [VIERA Link] to [OFF]. (→40)

Recording

Cannot record pictures.

- Built-in memory/card is full.
 - \rightarrow Free space by deleting unwanted pictures (\rightarrow 163).

Recorded pictures look white.

- Lens is dirty (fingerprints, etc.).
 - → Turn on power to extract lens barrel, and clean lens surface with a soft, dry cloth.
- Lens is foggy $(\rightarrow 6)$.

Recorded pictures are too bright/too dark.

- Adjust the exposure (→124).
- [Min. Shtr Speed] is set to fast speed. Check the setting (\rightarrow 141).

Some pictures are taken when I press the shutter button just once.

• The following functions are set.

[Burst Shooting] (→118) [WB Bracket] (→114) [Aspect Bracket] (→122) [Auto Bracket] (→125)

Focus not aligned correctly.

- Not set to mode appropriate for distance to subject. (Focus range varies according to recording mode.)
- Subject outside of focus range. (→96, 102)
- Caused by jitter or subject movement. (→142)

Recorded pictures are blurred. Optical Image Stabilizer ineffective.

- Shutter speed is slower in dark locations and Optical Image Stabilizer is less effective.
 - → Hold camera firmly with both hands, keeping arms close to body.
- Use a tripod and the self-timer (→116) when using slower shutter speed with [Min. Shtr Speed].

Recording (continued)

Cannot use [WB Bracket].

- Built-in memory/card is full.
 - \rightarrow Free space by deleting unwanted pictures (\rightarrow 163).

Recorded pictures appear coarse, or there is interference.

- ISO Sensitivity is high, or shutter speed is low.
 - (Default [Sensitivity] setting is [AUTO] interference may appear with indoor pictures.)
 - \rightarrow Lower [Sensitivity] (\rightarrow 109).
 - → Take pictures in brighter locations.

Striping or flicker may appear under lighting such as fluorescent lighting and LED lighting fixture.

This is characteristic of MOS sensors which serve as the camera's pickup sensors.
 This is not a malfunction.



Brightness or coloring of recorded picture different from real life.

- When recording under fluorescent or LED lighting fixture etc., increasing the shutter speed may
 introduce slight changes to brightness and color. These are a result of the characteristics of the light
 source and do not indicate a malfunction.
- When recording subjects in extremely bright locations or recording under fluorescent lighting, LED lighting fixture, mercury lamp, sodium lighting etc., the colors and screen brightness may change or horizontal striping may appear on the screen.

The zoom does not function normally.

- The zoom operates in steps.
 - \rightarrow Set [Step Zoom] to [OFF] (\rightarrow 95).

Reddish horizontal streaks appear on the LCD monitor during recording.

- This is characteristic of the MOS sensors, which serve as the camera's pickup sensors. The streaks appear when the subject has a bright part. Some unevenness may occur in the surrounding areas, but this is not a malfunction. It is recorded in motion pictures but is not recorded on still pictures.
- It is recommended that you take pictures while taking care not to expose the screen to sunlight or any other source of strong light.

Motion picture recording stops midway.

- With some cards, access display may appear briefly after recording, and recording may end midway.
- If recording stops even when using a card of the recommended speed class (→20), the data writing speed has dropped. If this happens, we recommend backing up the data on the memory card and formatting it (→42).
- You can continuously record a motion picture in [MP4] for up to 29 minutes 59 seconds or approx.
 4 GB. (Since recording in [MP4] with [FHD] creates larger files, the recording time for such motion pictures will be shorter than 29 minutes 59 seconds.)
- If [Rec Quality] of [AVCHD] motion pictures is set to [PSH] or [FSH], you can continuously record a
 motion picture for up to 29 minutes 59 seconds.

Recording (continued)

The subject appears distorted.

• An MOS is used as the imaging device for this unit, so if the subject passes quickly in front of the lens, it will appear slightly distorted. Note, however, that this does not indicate a malfunction.

An unusual noise, such as a clicking or buzzing noise, is recorded on a motion picture. The audio level is extremely low.

- When recording a motion picture in a quiet environment, noise due to the motion of the aperture and focusing mechanism may be recorded on the motion picture. Note that this is not a fault. You can set the focus operation during motion picture recording to [OFF] using [Continuous AF] (→151).
- Note that if you perform operations such as zoom, using buttons or dials, while recording a motion
 picture, operation noise may be recorded.
- If you block off the microphone opening while recording a motion picture, the audio level may be low, or the audio may not be recorded. Note that in this case, noise due to the motion of the lens is more likely to be recorded.

Panorama picture recording stops before finishing.

- If the pan motion of the camera is too slow, the camera assumes that the operation has been aborted and stops recording.
- If the pan motion of the camera is too shaky when it is moved toward the recording direction, the camera stops recording.
 - → To record panorama pictures, pan the camera in a small circular motion parallel to the recording direction at a speed of approx. 8 seconds per revolution (guideline).

The subject cannot be locked. (AF track fails)

 If the color of the subject is similar to that of its background, AF Tracking may not function. Set the AF lock to the colors specific to the subject.

Flash

No flash emitted.

- The flash is retracted into the camera housing.
 - → Operate the flash open switch to open the flash.
- The flash becomes unavailable in the following cases :
 - [Burst Shooting] (Excluding [型])
 - [WB Bracket] [Aspect Bracket] [Auto Bracket]
 - Scene Modes ([Scenery] [Panorama Shot] [Night Scenery] [Handheld Night Shot] [HDR] [Sunset] [Glass Through] [3D Photo Mode])
 - [Creative Control] mode (excluding [Smooth Defocus] and [Radial Defocus])

Multiple flashes are emitted.

- Red-eye reduction is active (→107). (Flashes twice to prevent eyes appearing red.)
- [Burst Shooting] is set to [4].

LCD monitor

No picture is displayed on the LCD monitor.

- [Opt. Viewfinder] is set to [ON].
- → Press [DISP.] button to switch to the LCD monitor display.
- The Live View Finder (optional) display is selected.
 - → Press the [LVF/LCD] button of the Live View Finder (optional) to switch to the LCD monitor display.

Brightness is unstable.

Aperture value is set while shutter button is pressed halfway. (Does not affect recorded picture.)
 This symptom may also occur when the brightness changes because the zoom is operated or the camera is moved. This is the automatic aperture operation of the camera and is not a malfunction.

Monitor flickers indoors.

• The LCD monitor may flicker for a few seconds after turning on. This is an operation to correct flicker caused by lighting such as fluorescent lights, LED lights etc. and is not a malfunction.

Monitor is too bright/too dark.

- [LCD Mode] is activated (→31)
- Use [LCD Display] to adjust the brightness of the LCD monitor. (→31)

Black/blue/red/green dots or interference appears. Monitor looks distorted when touched.

This is not a fault, and will not be recorded on the actual pictures.

Even when you press the [LVF/LCD] button of the Live View Finder (optional), the display does not switch between the LCD monitor and Live View Finder.

 When it is connected to a computer or printer, the camera can display pictures on the LCD monitor only.

Playback

Pictures have been rotated.

■ [Rotate Disp.] is activated (→40)

Cannot view pictures. There are no recorded pictures.

- No pictures in built-in memory or card (pictures played from card if inserted, from built-in memory if not).
- Has the file name of the picture been changed on a computer? If so, it cannot be played back on the camera
- The [Playback Model has been changed.
 - → Set [Playback Mode] to [Normal Play] (→152).

Folder/file number displayed as [-]. Picture is black.

- Picture edited on computer or taken with different device.
- Battery removed immediately after picture taken, or picture taken with low battery.
 → Use [Format] to delete (→42).

Incorrect date displayed in Calendar Playback.

- Picture edited on computer or taken on different device.
- [Clock Set] is incorrect (→27).
 (Incorrect date may be displayed in Calendar Playback on pictures copied to computer and then back to camera, if computer and camera dates differ.)

White round spots like soap bubbles appear on the recorded picture.

• If you take a picture with the flash in a dark place or indoors, white round spots may appear on the picture caused by the flash reflecting particles of dust in the air. This is not a fault. A characteristic of this is that the number of round spots and their position differ in every picture.



Part of a picture flashes in black and white.

• [Highlight] is set to [ON].

[Thumbnail is displayed] is shown on the screen.

• The pictures may have been recorded on another device. If so, they may be displayed with poor picture quality.

Red areas in pictures appear blackened.

- When digital red-eye correction (\$A\$\, \$\\$\$) is operating, if a subject is recorded that has skincolored areas with red areas inside, the digital red-eye correction function may blacken the red areas.
 - → We recommend setting the flash to [¼A], [¼] or [⑥], or [Red-Eye Removal] to [OFF] before recording. (When the built-in flash is closed, [⑥] (Forced flash off) is set regardless of the flash setting.)

Sounds of camera operations such as zoom will be recorded in motion pictures.

 Camera operation sounds may be recorded as camera automatically adjusts lens aperture during motion picture recording; this is not a fault.

Motion pictures taken with this camera cannot be played in other cameras.

• When motion pictures recorded in AVCHD or MP4 using this camera are played back, they may be displayed with poor picture and sound quality or may not be played back at all even if an AVCHD or MP4 compatible device is used. Also, the recording information may not be displayed correctly.

TV, computer, printer

No image appears on TV. Image blurred or not colored.

- Not connected correctly (→183).
- The television has not been switched to auxiliary input.

TV screen display different to LCD monitor.

Aspect ratio may be incorrect or edges may be cut off with certain televisions.

Cannot play motion pictures on TV.

- Card is inserted into TV.
 - → Connect with AV cable (optional) or HDMI mini cable (optional) and play on camera (→183).

Picture is not displayed on full TV screen.

Check [TV Aspect] settings (→39).

No sound is output from the camera speaker.

 When the AV cable (optional) or HDMI mini cable (optional) is connected to the camera, no sound is output from the camera.

VIERA Link (HDMI) is not working.

- Is the HDMI mini cable (optional) connected correctly? (→183)
 - → Check that the HDMI mini cable (optional) is fully inserted.
- Is the camera's [VIERA Link] setting set to [ON]? $(\rightarrow 40)$
 - → The input setting may not be able to be changed automatically with certain television HDMI sockets. In this case, please change the input setting with your television's remote control (consult your television's operating instructions for details).
 - → Check the VIERA Link (HDMI) settings on the device you are connecting to.
 - → Turn the camera's power off and on again.
 - → Turn the "VIERA Link control (HDMI device control)" setting on your television (VIERA) to off and then to on again. (Consult your VIERA's operating instructions for details.)

TV, computer, printer (continued)

Cannot communicate with the computer.

- Not connected correctly (→191).
- Check whether computer has recognized camera.
 - \rightarrow Set [USB Mode] to [PC] (\rightarrow 39).
 - → Turn the camera off and then on again.

Computer does not recognize card (only reads built-in memory).

Disconnect USB connection cable and reconnect with card in place.

Computer does not recognize card. (When using an SDXC Memory Cards)

- → Check whether your computer is compatible with SDXC Memory Cards. http://panasonic.net/avc/sdcard/information/SDXC.html
- → A message prompting you to format the card may appear when you connect it. Do not format the card.
- → If the [Access] indicator on the LCD monitor does not go off, turn off the camera's power before disconnecting the USB connection cable.

Uploading to YouTube or Facebook cannot be performed properly.

- → Confirm that the login information (login ID, user name, e-mail address and password) is correct.
- → Confirm that the computer is connected to the Internet.
- → Confirm that the resident software (such as anti-virus software and the firewall, etc.) is not blocking access to YouTube or Facebook.
- → Check the YouTube or Facebook site.

Cannot print when connecting to printer.

- Printer not compatible with PictBridge.
- Set [USB Mode] to [PictBridge(PTP)] (→39).

The edges of pictures are cut off when printing.

- Release any trimming or edgeless printing settings on printer before printing.
 (Consult printer operating manual.)
- The aspect ratio of pictures is different from that of paper used for printing.
 - → If printing in shop, check if 16:9 sizes can be printed.

Cannot print panorama pictures properly.

- The aspect ratio of panorama pictures is different from that of regular still pictures, and some panorama pictures may not be printed correctly.
 - → Use a printer with support for panorama pictures. (Refer to the instruction manual for the printer.)
 - → We recommend adjusting the size of a picture in accordance with print paper using the "PHOTOfunSTUDIO" software on the CD-ROM (supplied).

Others

Menu not displayed in desired language.

Change [Language] setting (→43).

Camera rattles if shaken.

This sound is made by the lens movement and is not a fault.

Red lamp illuminated when pressing shutter button halfway in dark locations.

[AF Assist Lamp] is set to [ON] (→143).

AF Assist Lamp is not illuminated.

- [AF Assist Lamp] is set to [OFF].
- Not illuminated in bright locations.

Camera is hot.

Camera may become a little warm during use, but this does not affect performance or quality.

Lens makes a clicking noise.

 When brightness changes, the lens may make a clicking noise and the monitor brightness may also change, but this is due to aperture settings being made.
 (Does not affect recording.)

Clock is incorrect.

- Camera has been left for a long period.
 - \rightarrow Reset the clock (\rightarrow 24).
- A long time was taken to set the clock (clock will be behind by the same lapse of time).

When using zoom, picture becomes slightly warped and the edges of the subject become colored.

Pictures may be slightly warped or colored around the edges, depending on the zoom ratio, but this
is not a fault.

Zoom movement stops momentarily.

 The zoom movement stops momentarily during Extended Optical Zoom operation, but this is not a malfunction.

File numbers are not recorded in sequence.

File numbers are reset when new folders are created (→38).

File numbers have jumped backwards.

Battery was removed/inserted with power on.
 (Numbers may jump backwards if folder/file numbers are not correctly recorded.)

When no operation is performed for a while, the demo is suddenly displayed.

This is the Automatic Demo Mode that introduces the features of this camera.
 Press [MENU/SET] to return to the previous screen.

When in use

- Camera may become warm if used for long periods of time, but this is not a fault.
- Keep this unit as far away as possible from electromagnetic equipment (such as microwave ovens, TVs, video games etc.).
 - If you use this unit on top of or near a TV, the pictures and/or sound on this unit may be disrupted by electromagnetic wave radiation.
 - Do not use this unit near cell phones because doing so may result in noise adversely affecting the pictures and/or sound.
 - Recorded data may be damaged, or pictures may be distorted, by strong magnetic fields created by speakers or large motors.
 - Electromagnetic wave radiation generated by microprocessors may adversely affect this unit, disturbing the pictures and/or sound.
 - If this unit is adversely affected by electromagnetic equipment and stops functioning properly, turn this unit off and remove the battery or disconnect AC adaptor (optional).
 Then reinsert the battery or reconnect AC adaptor and turn this unit on.

Do not use this unit near radio transmitters or high-voltage lines.

- If you record near radio transmitters or high-voltage lines, the recorded pictures and/ or sound may be adversely affected.
- Do not keep objects that may be influenced magnetically close to the speaker.
 - Magnetized objects such as bank cards, commuter passes, watches, may be adversely affected by the magnetic influence of the speaker.
- Do not extend the supplied cord or cable.
- Do not allow camera to come into contact with pesticides or volatile substances (can cause surface damage or coating to peel).
- Never leave the camera and the battery in a car or on a car hood in the summer. Doing so may cause leakage of the battery electrolyte overheating, fire or a battery explosion due to the high temperature.

Caring for your camera

To clean your camera, remove the battery or disconnect the power plug from the outlet, and wipe with a soft, dry cloth.

- Use a damp cloth to remove stubborn stains, before wiping with a dry cloth.
- Do not use benzine, thinners, alcohol, or kitchen detergent, as these may damage the outer casing and finish of the camera.
- If using a chemically-treated cloth, read the supplied instructions carefully.

When not using for a while

- Turn off camera power before removing battery and card (ensure that battery is removed to prevent damage through over-discharge).
- Do not leave in contact with rubber or plastic bags.
- Store together with a drying agent (silica gel) if leaving in drawer, etc. Store batteries in cool (15 °C to 25 °C (59 °F to 77 °F)) places with low humidity (40%RH to 60%RH) and no major temperature changes.
- Charge battery once per year and use completely before storing again.

Memory cards

- To prevent damage to cards and data
 - Avoid high temperatures, direct sunlight, electromagnetic waves, and static electricity.
 - Do not bend, drop, or expose to strong impacts.
 - Do not touch terminals on reverse of card or allow them to become dirty or wet.
- When disposing of/transferring memory cards
 - If using the "format" or "delete" functions on your camera or computer, this only
 changes the file management information, and does not completely delete the data
 from within the memory card. When disposing of or transferring your memory cards,
 we recommend physically destroying them, or using commercially available computer
 data erasing software to completely delete the data from the card. Data within
 memory cards should be managed responsibly.

LCD Monitor

- Do not press hard on the LCD monitor. This may cause uneven display and damage the monitor.
- In cold climates or other situations when the camera becomes cold, the LCD monitor may appear slightly darker than normal immediately after the camera is turned on. Normal brightness will return once the internal components have warmed up.

Extremely high precision technology is employed to produce the LCD monitor screen. However there may be some dark or bright spots (red, blue or green) on the screen. This is not a malfunction. The LCD monitor screen has more than 99.99% effective pixels with fewer than 0.01% of the pixels inactive or always lit. The spots will not be recorded on pictures in the built-in memory or a card.

Charging the battery

- The time required for charging varies depending on conditions of battery usage. Charging takes longer at high or low temperatures and when the battery has not been used in some time.
- Battery will be warm during charging and for some time thereafter.
- Battery will run out if not used for long periods of time, even after being charged.
- Do not leave any metal items (such as clips) near the contact areas of the power plug.
 Otherwise, a fire and/or electric shocks may be caused by short-circuiting or the resulting heat generated.
- Frequently charging up battery is not recommended.
 (Frequently charging battery reduces maximum usage time and can cause battery to expand.)
- If available battery power is significantly reduced, battery is reaching end of lifespan.
 Please purchase a new battery.
- When charging:
 - Wipe dirt from the battery terminal with a dry cloth.
 - Keep at least 1 m (3.3 feet) away from AM radio (may cause radio interference).
- Do not use a damaged or dented battery (especially connectors), e.g. by dropping (can cause faults).

Charger

- Depending on the environment while charging, the charging light may flicker due to static electricity or electromagnetic radiation, etc. This has no effect on charging.
- Keep at least 1 m (3.3 feet) away from AM radio (may cause radio interference).
- The charger may generate whirring sounds when it is being used. This is not a malfunction.
- After use, be sure to disconnect the power supply device from the electrical outlet. (A very small amount of current is consumed if it is left connected.)

Lens

- Images may appear slightly white if lens is dirty (fingerprints, etc.). Turn the power on, hold the extracted lens barrel with your fingers, and gently wipe the lens surface with a soft, dry cloth.
- Do not leave the lens exposed to direct sunlight.

When using a tripod or unipod

- Do not apply excessive force or tighten screws when they are crooked. (This may damage the camera, screw hole, or label.)
- Ensure that the tripod is stable. (Refer to the tripod instructions.)
- You may not be able to remove the card or the battery when using a tripod or unipod.

3D viewing

- Anyone who is hypersensitive to light, suffers from heart disease or is otherwise unwell should avoid viewing 3D pictures.
 - Viewing 3D pictures may have an adverse effect to the individual.
- If you feel tired, uncomfortable or otherwise strange when viewing 3D pictures, stop viewing at once.
 - · Continuing to view may cause illness.
 - · After stopping viewing, please rest appropriately.
- When viewing 3D pictures, we recommend taking a break every 30 to 60 minutes.
 - Viewing for extended periods may cause eye-fatigue.
- Short-sighted or long-sighted persons, those with differences in the sight of their right and left eyes, and those with astigmatism are advised to correct their vision by wearing glasses etc.

Stop viewing if you can clearly see a double image while watching 3D pictures.

- There are differences in the way that different people experience 3D pictures. Please correct your sight appropriately before viewing 3D pictures.
- You can change the 3D setting of your television or 3D output setting of the unit to 2D.

Personal Information

If names or birthdays are set in [Baby] Mode or in the [Face Recog.] function, keep in mind that the camera and recorded pictures will contain personal information.

- Disclaimer
 - Data containing personal information can be altered or lost due to malfunction, static electricity, accidents, breakdowns, repairs, or other operations.
 - Panasonic will not be liable for any damage that occurs, direct or indirect, as a result of the alteration or loss of data containing personal information.
- When ordering repairs or transferring/disposing of the camera
 - To protect your personal information, please reset the settings. $(\rightarrow 39)$
 - If any pictures are contained in the built-in memory, copy (→182) them to a memory card
 if necessary, and then format (→42) the built-in memory.
 - · Remove the memory card from the camera.
 - When ordering repairs, the built-in memory and other settings may be returned to the initial purchase state.
 - If the above operations cannot be performed because of a camera malfunction, consult with the dealer or nearest Service Center.

When transferring or disposing of your memory card, see "When disposing of/ transferring memory cards" in the previous section (\rightarrow 223).
